# Introducing APNIC

# What is APNIC?

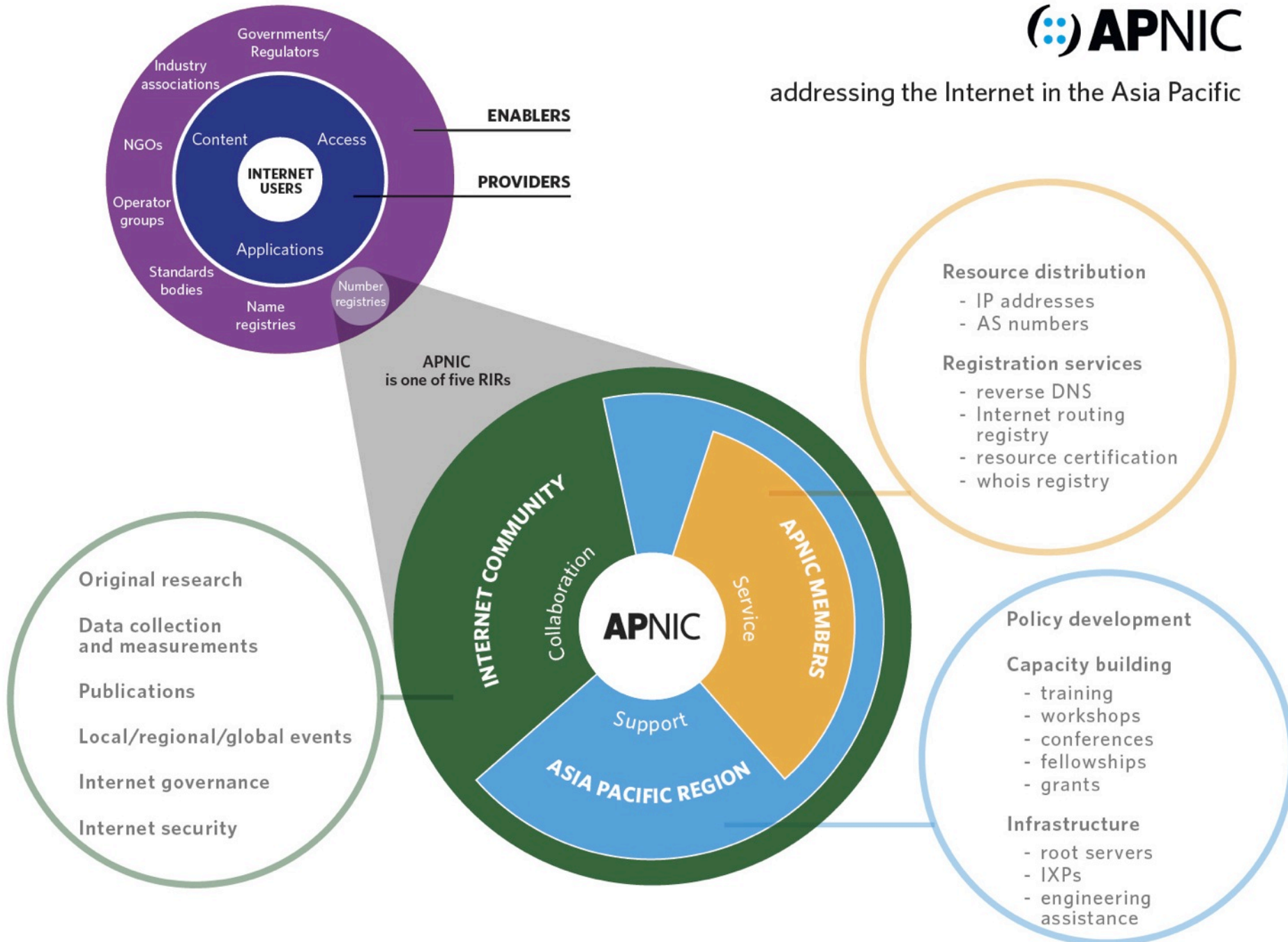
- Regional Internet Registry (RIR) for the Asia Pacific region
  - Comprises 56 economies
- Secretariat located in Brisbane, Australia
  - Currently employs around 70 staff
- Not-for-profit, membership-based organization
- Governed by the Executive Council (EC), who are elected by the Members



# Regional Internet Registries



addressing the Internet in the Asia Pacific



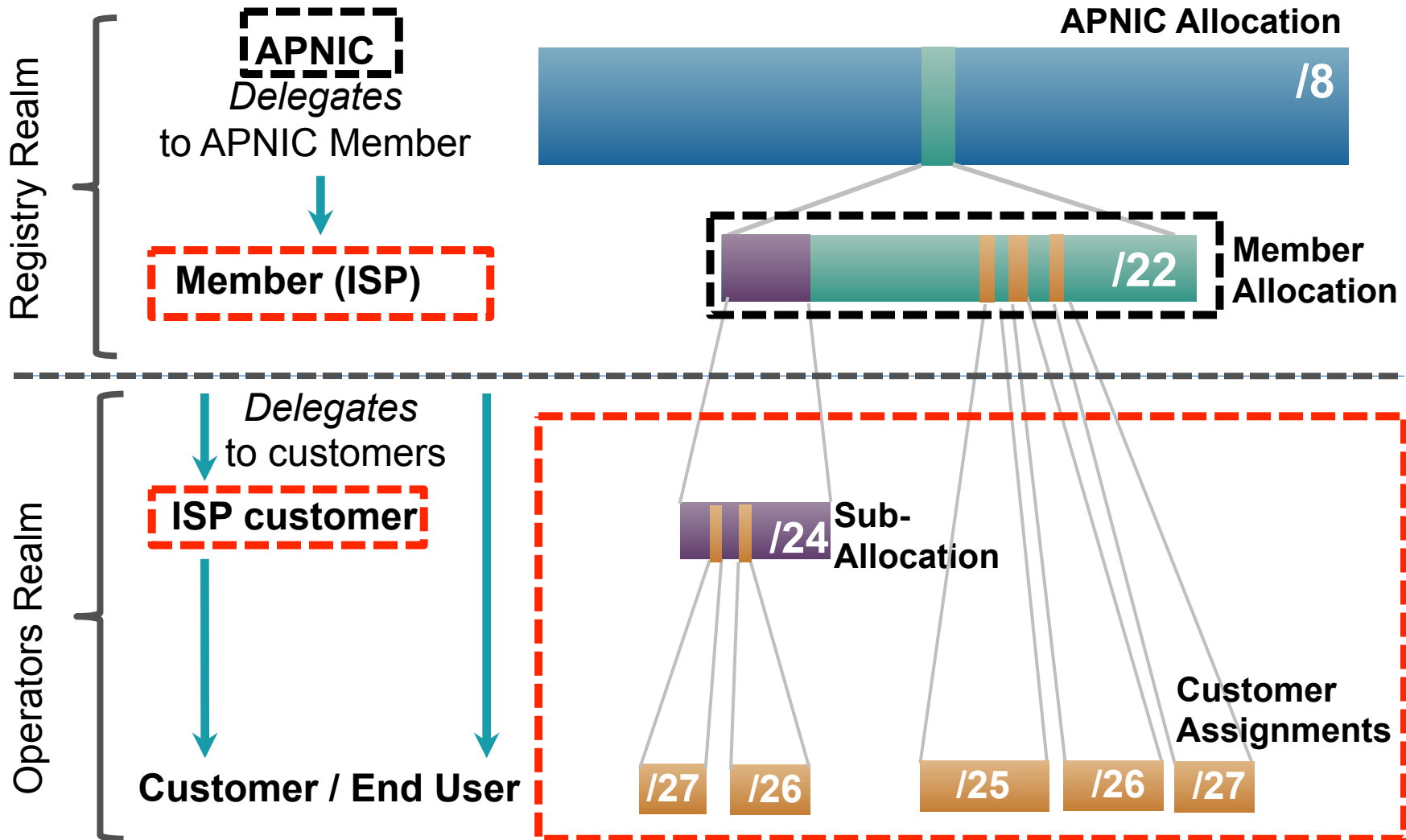


- **Delegates and manages Internet resources**
  - IPv4 and IPv6 addresses
  - AS Numbers
- **Maintains the APNIC Whois Database**
- **Manages Reverse DNS delegations**
  - *But is NOT a domain name registry*
- **Facilitates IP address policy development**
- **Provides training and outreach on resource management, in particular IPv6 deployment**
- **Provides Conference events**
- **Is an authoritative source of information**
  - LABs
- **Supports Internet development**
  - Root server deployment, ISIF

# ***Australia's accession to Budapest Convention***

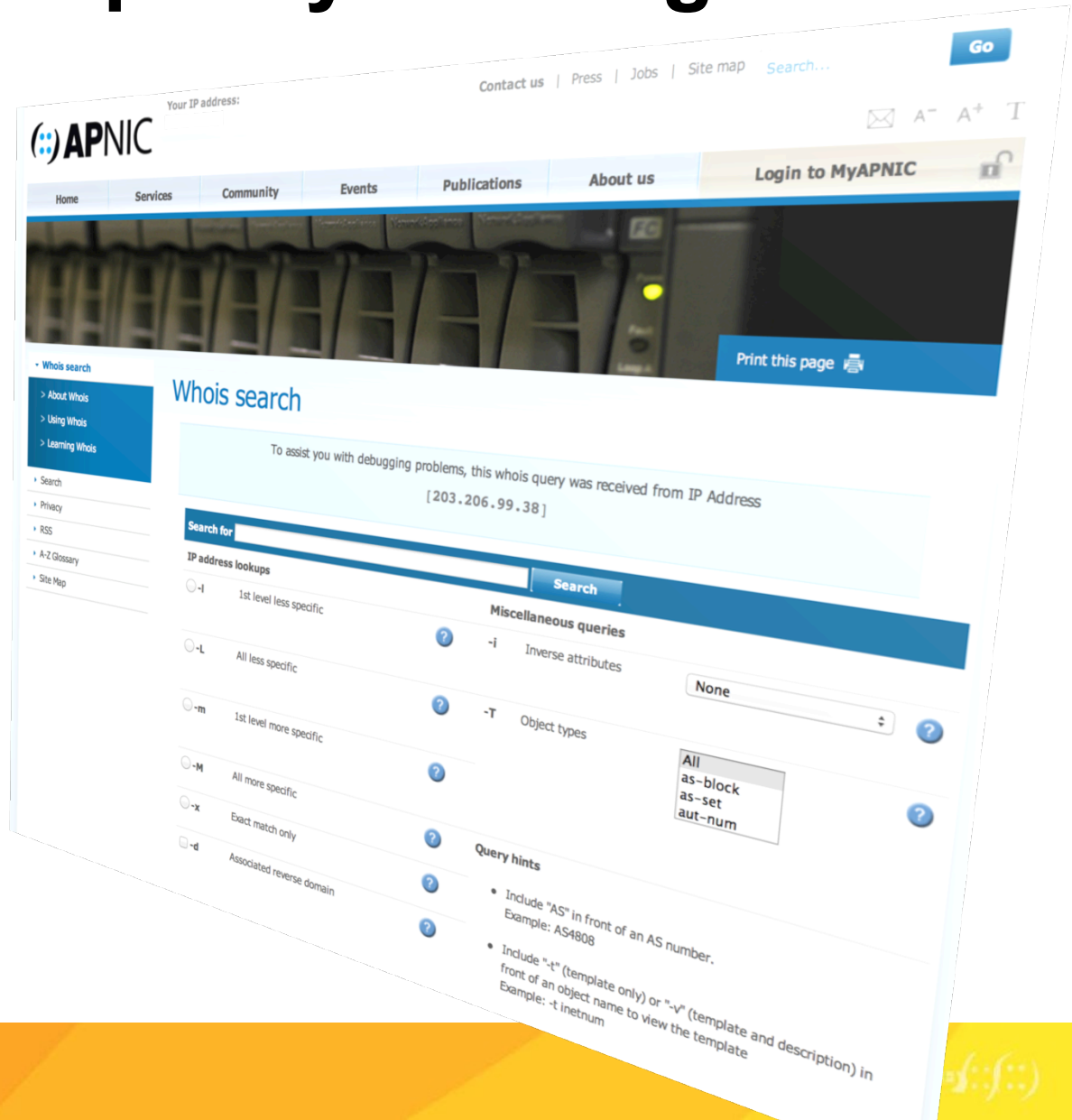
- APNIC is located in Brisbane, Australia – subject to Australian laws and jurisdiction
- Australia's accession came into force on 1 March 2013
- Budapest Convention provides:
  - Consistent and harmonised substantial criminal law
  - Procedural law tools for law enforcement (including safeguards)
  - Efficient international cooperation
