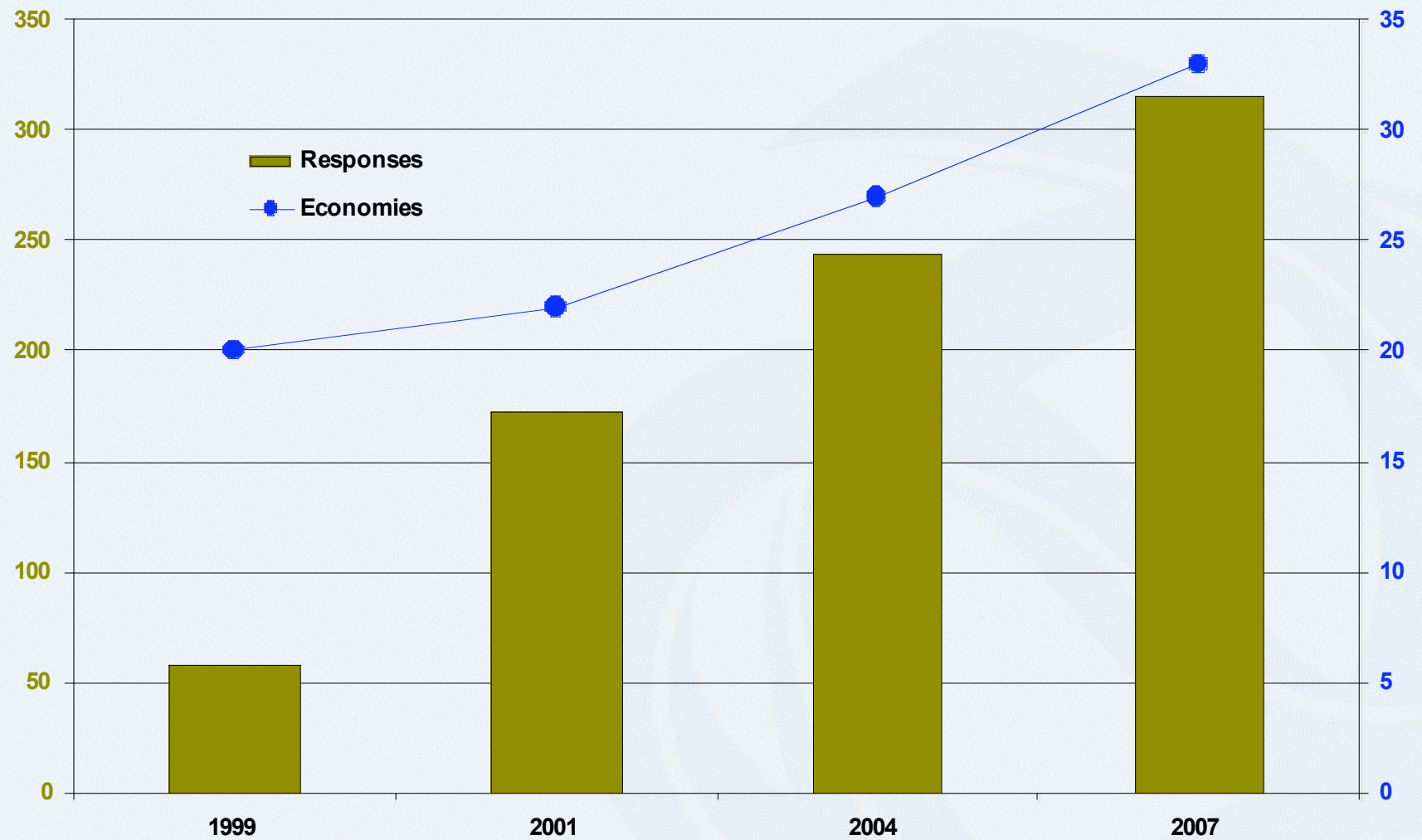

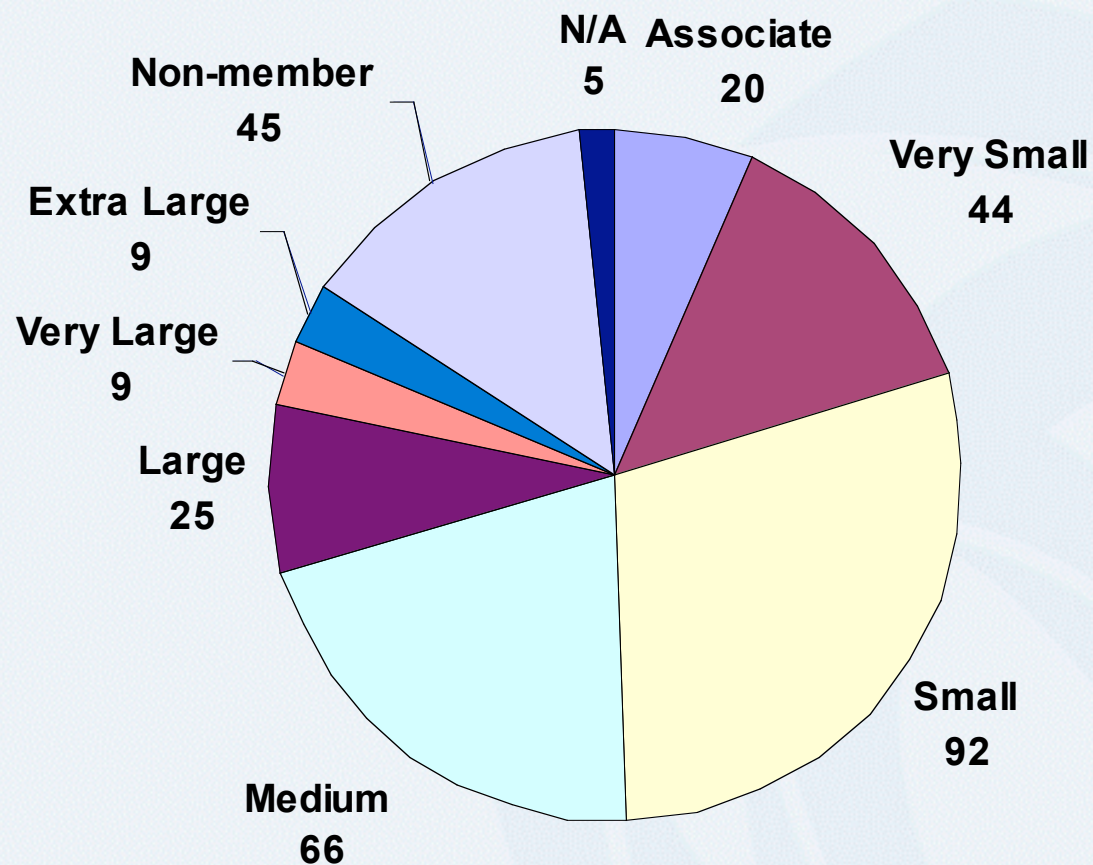

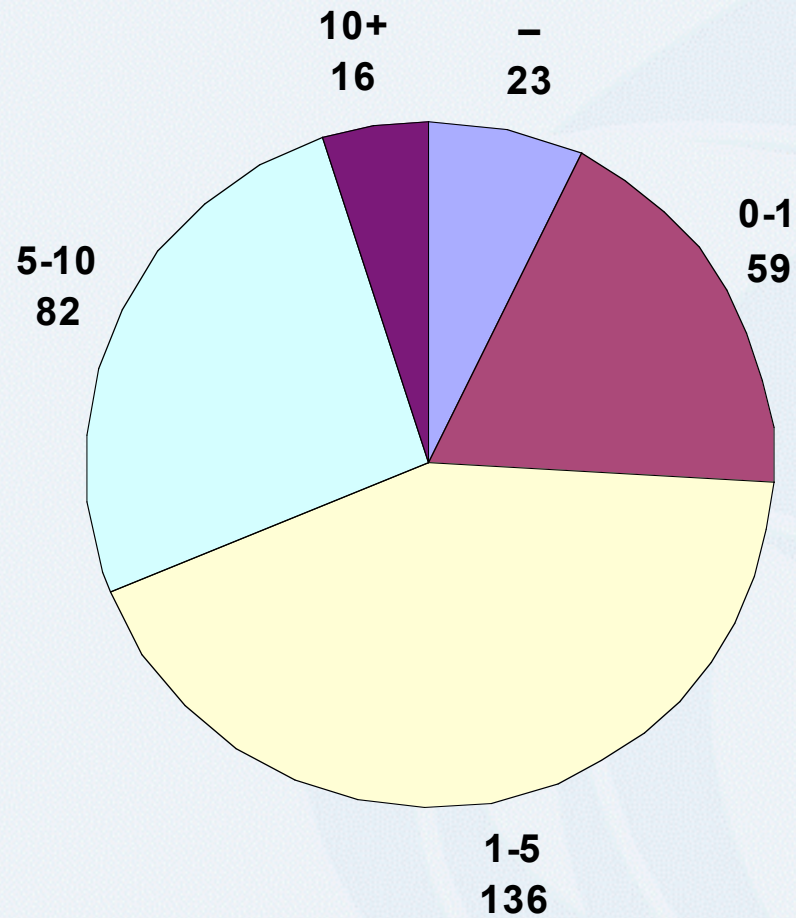

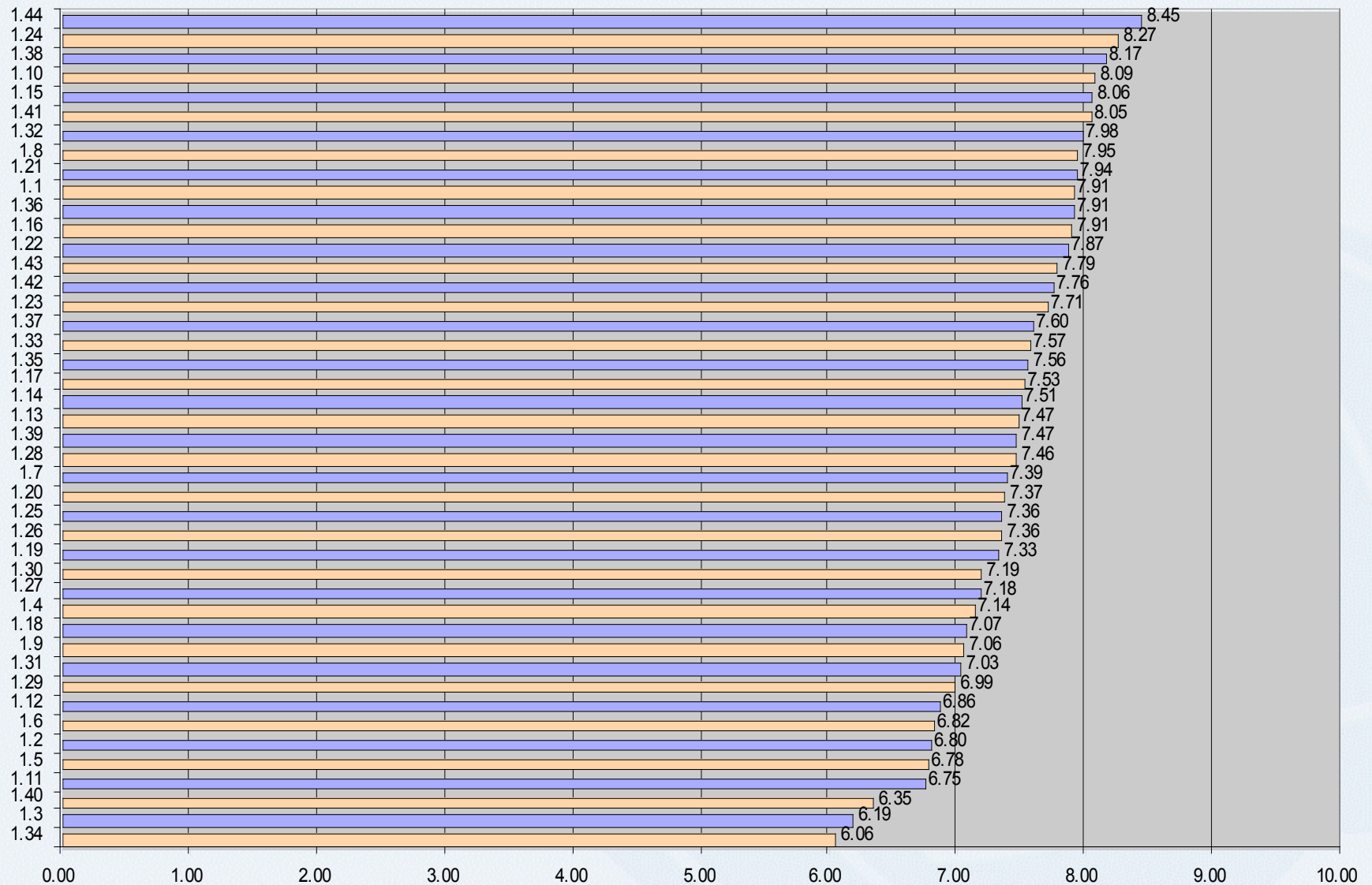
Survey 2007 – Membership category

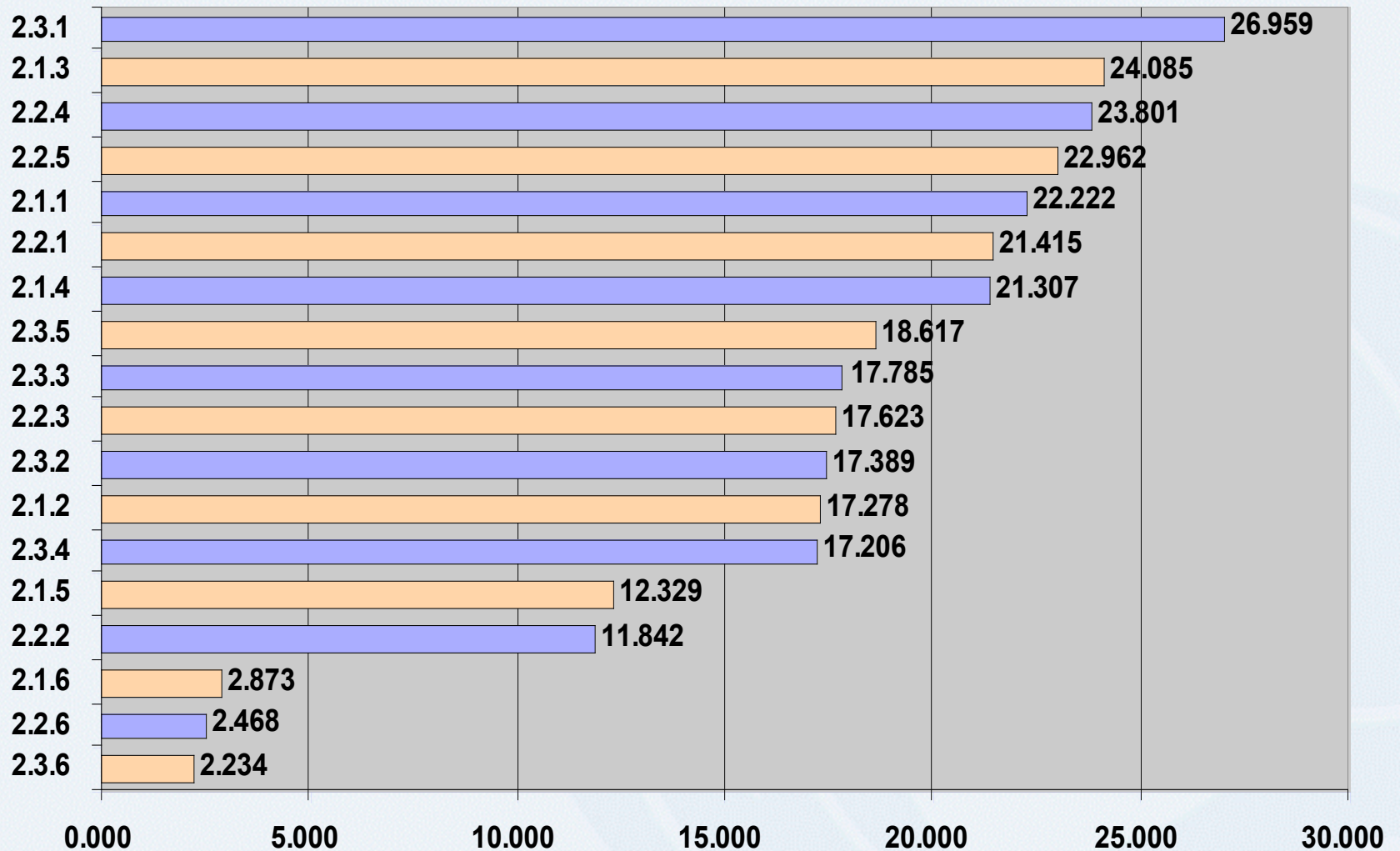

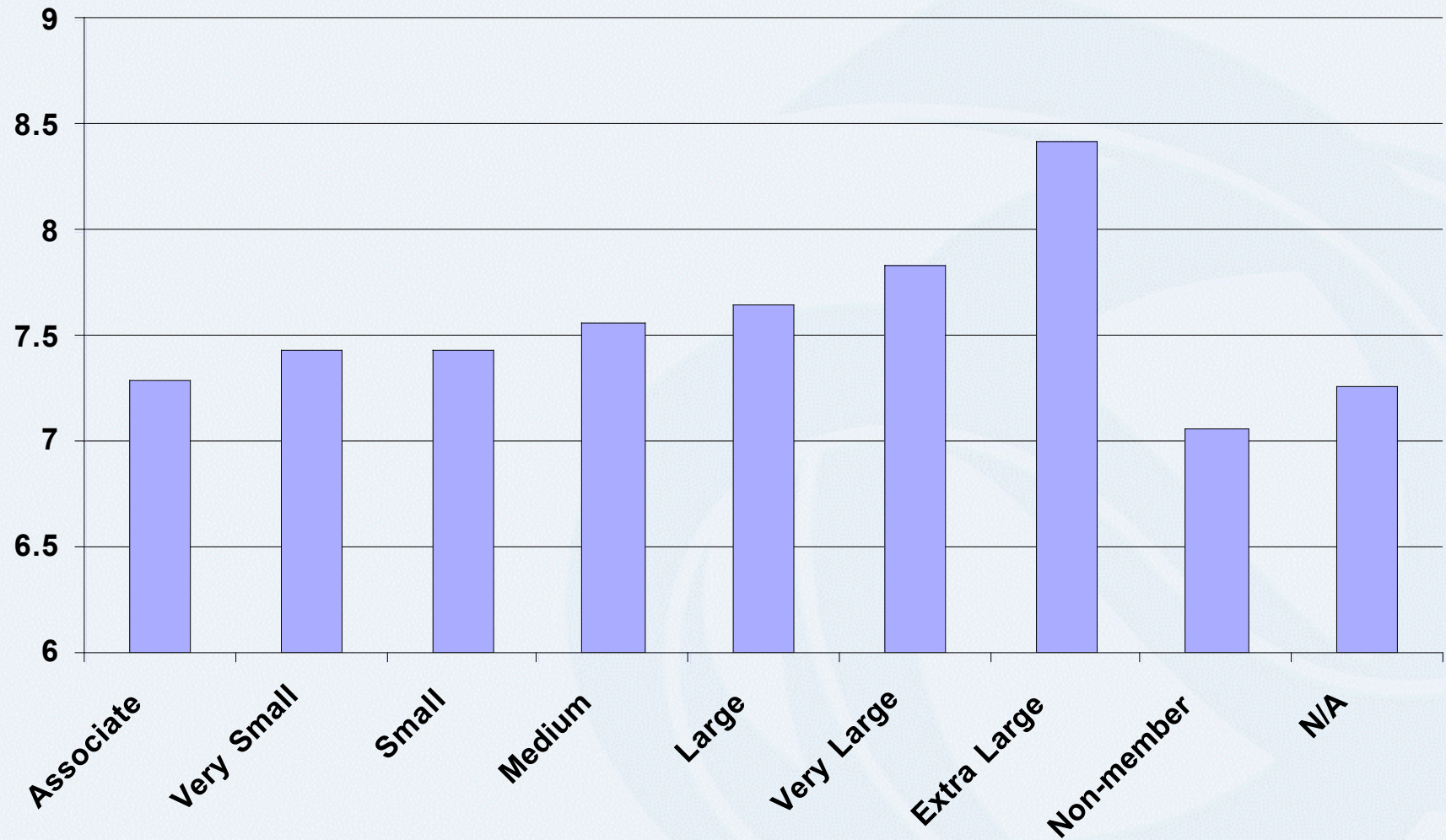

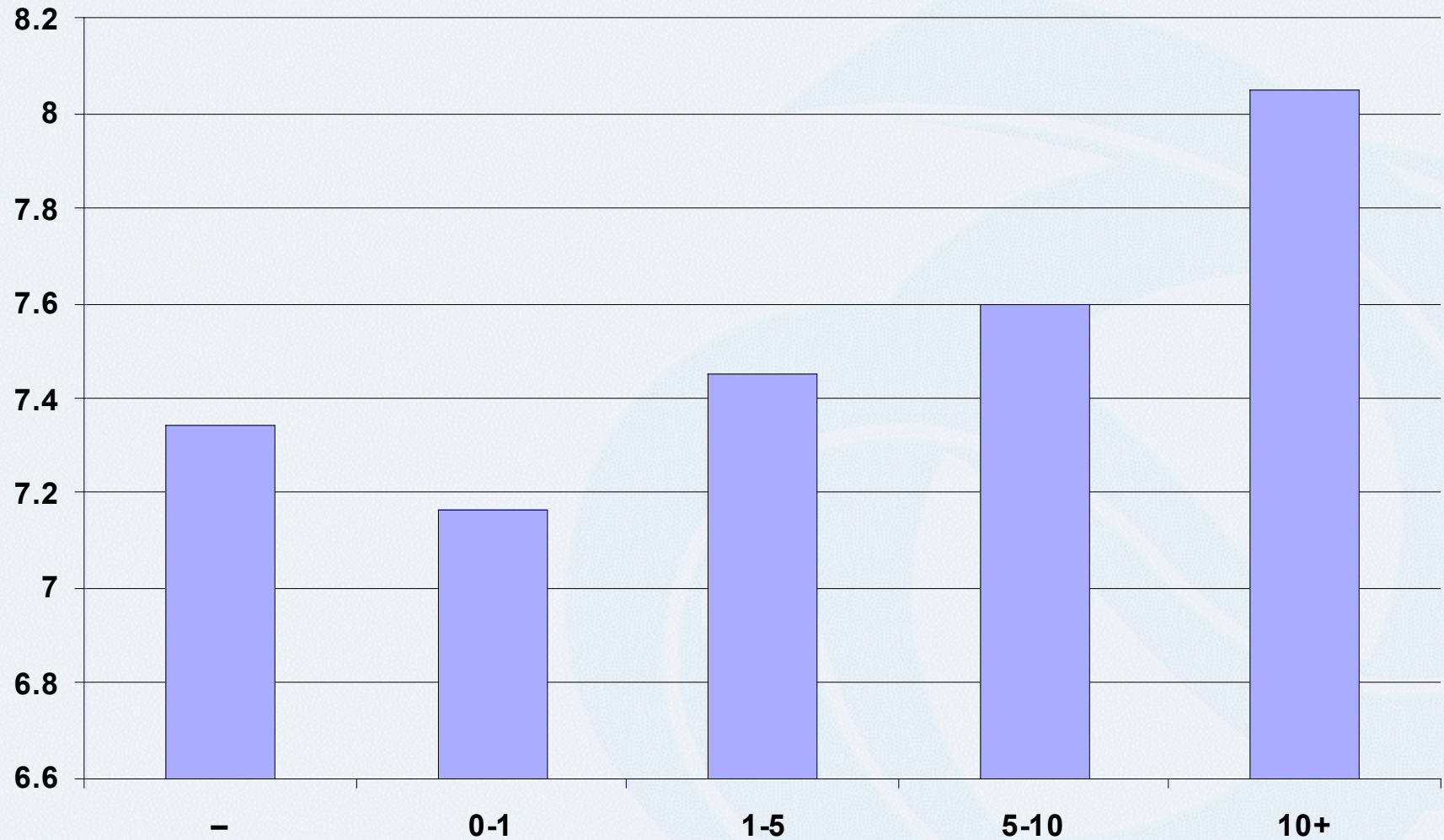
Part 2 – Top 10
