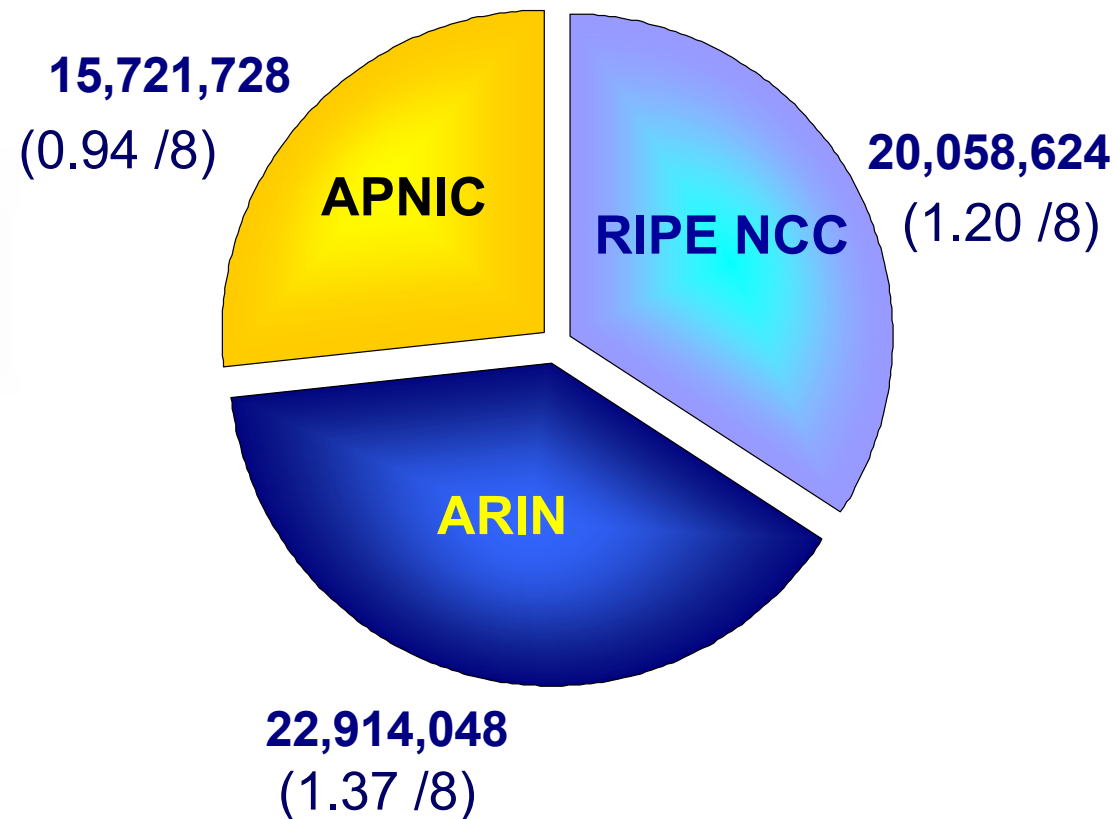

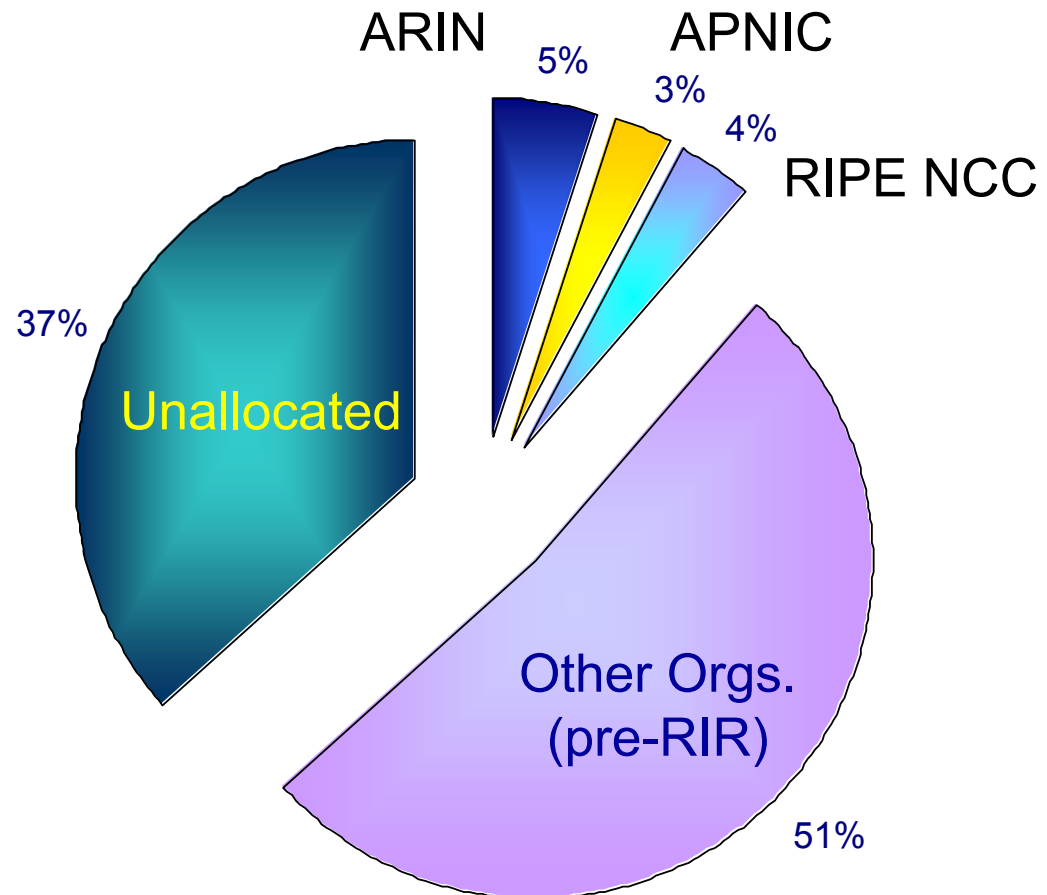

Global IPv4 Allocation 2001*

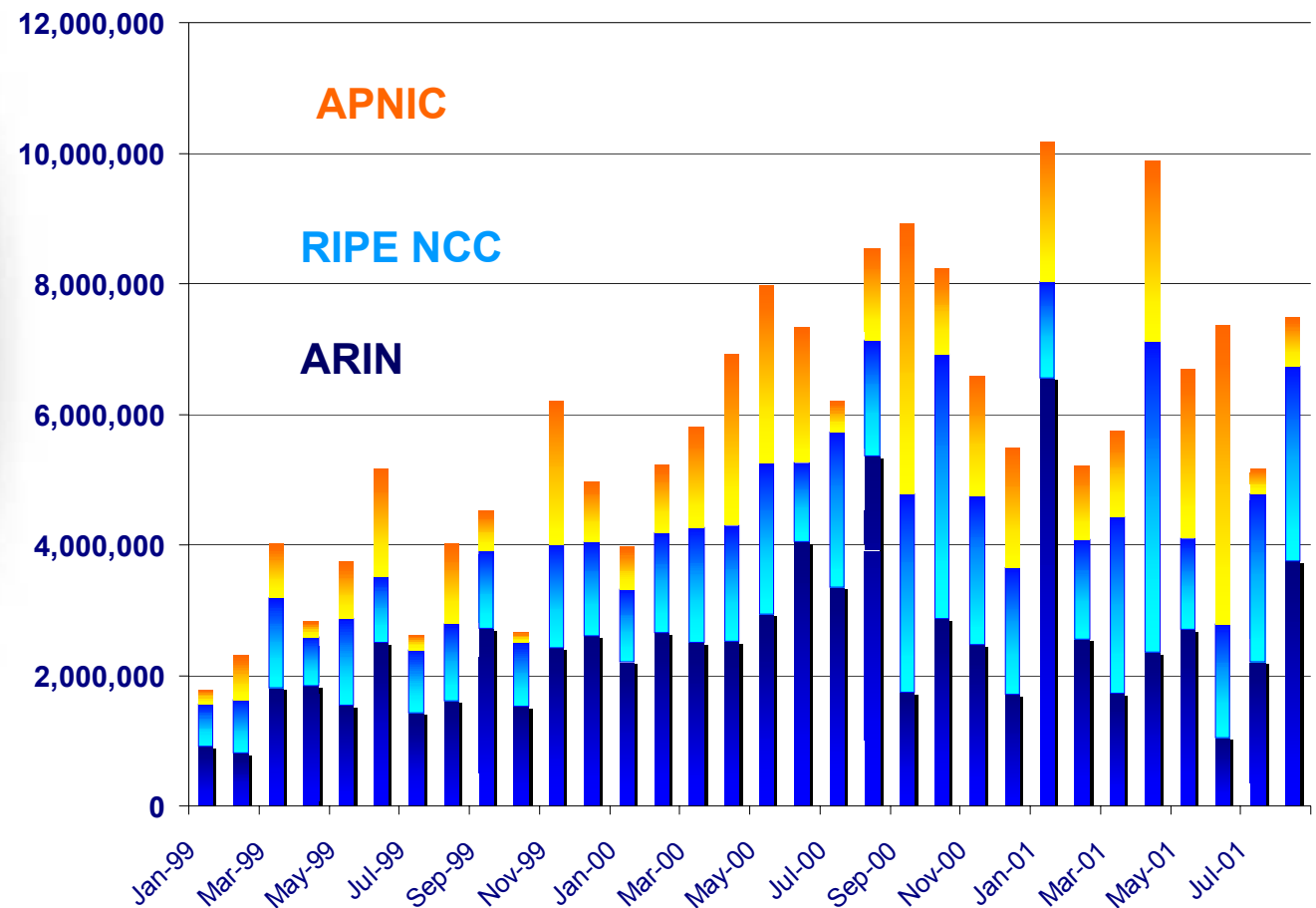

IANA IPv4 Delegations

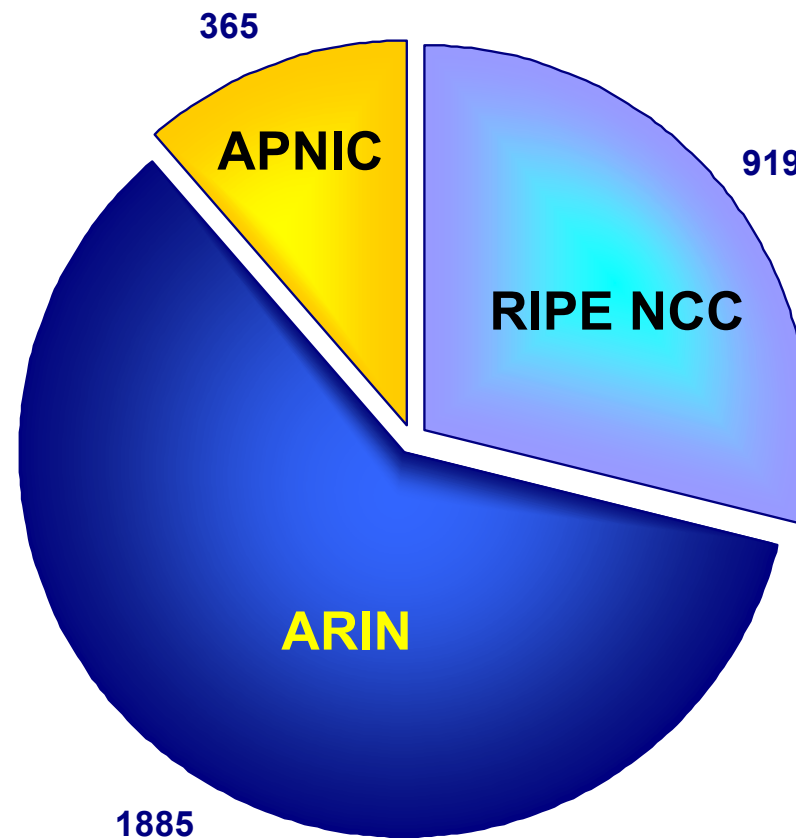


IPv4 Allocation 1999 - 2001

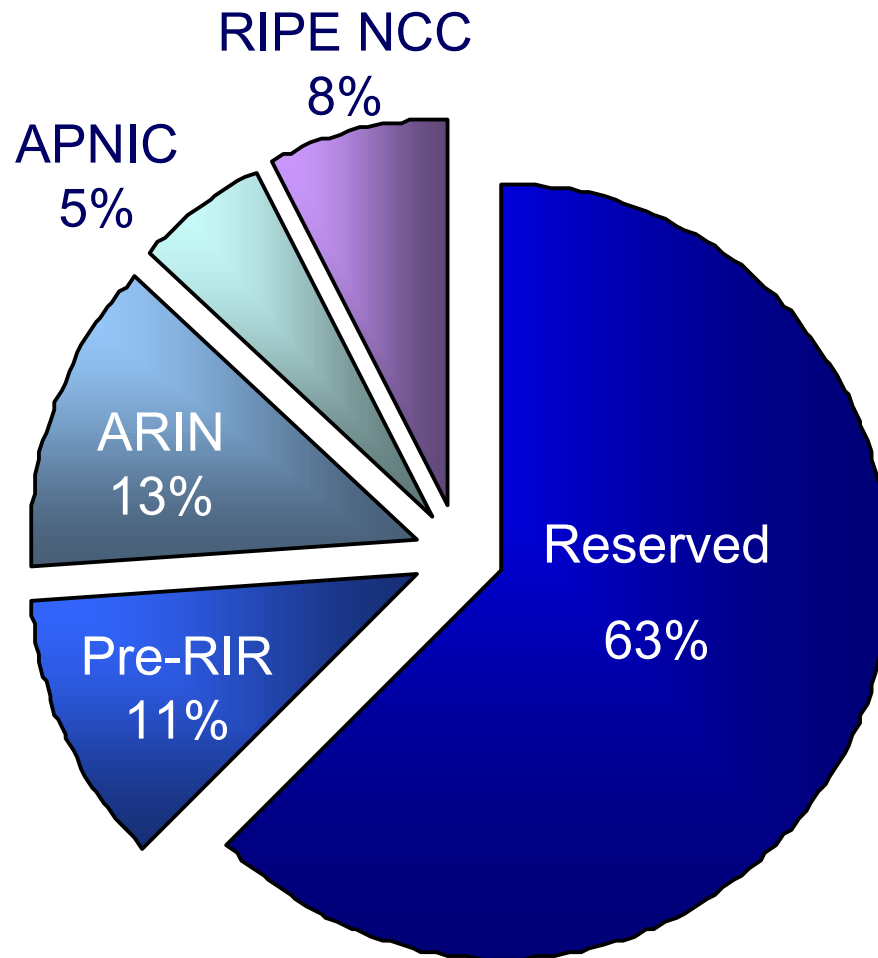


Global AS Number Distribution 2001*

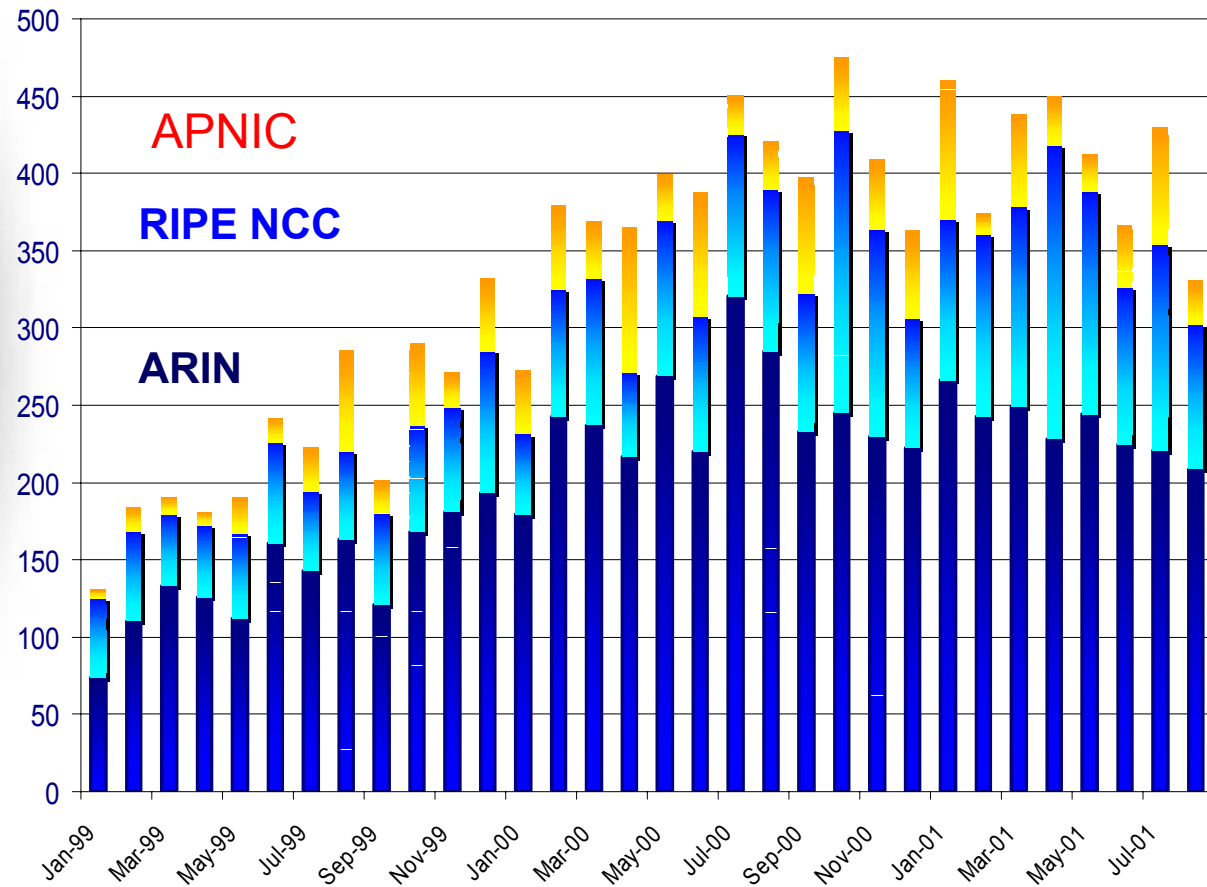

IANA AS Number Delegations

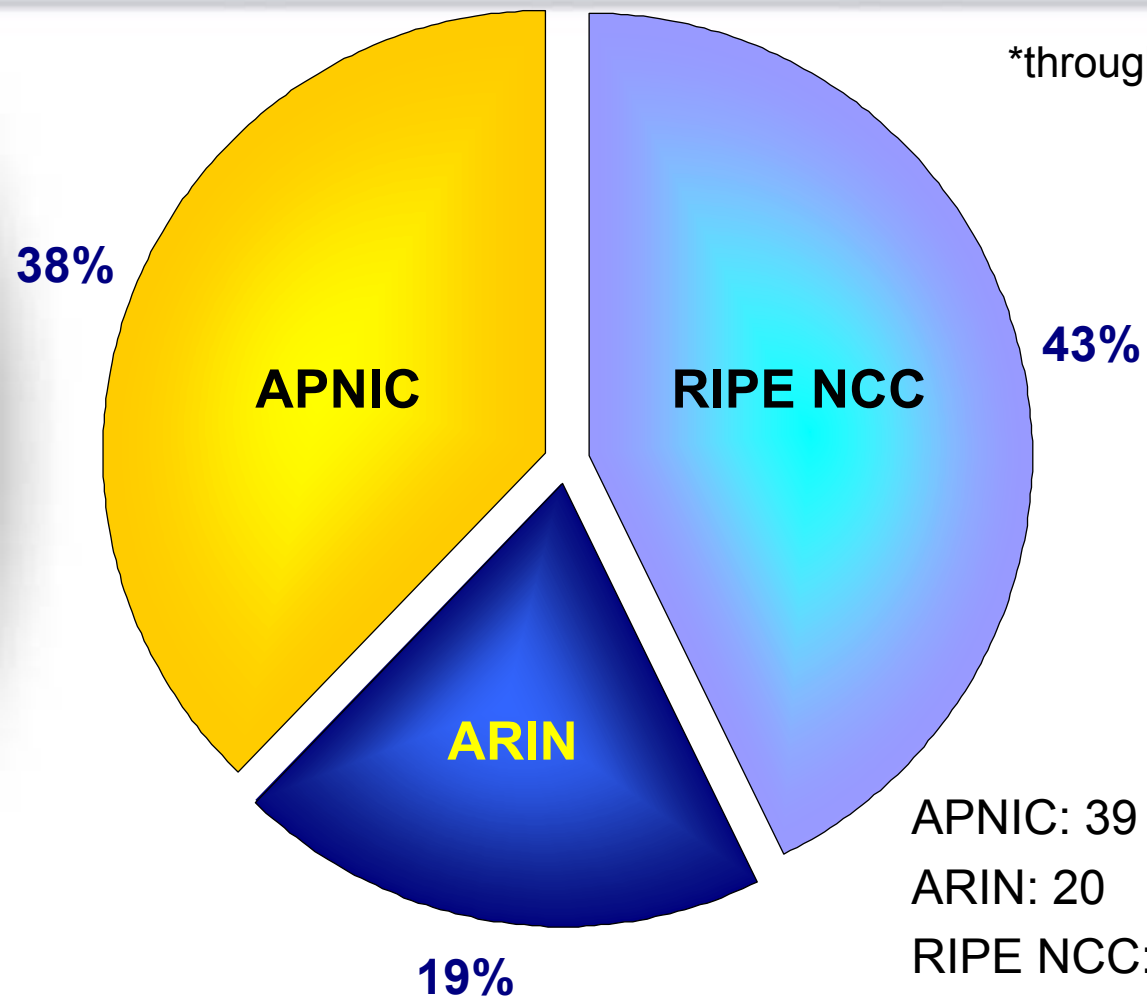


AS Number Assignments 1999 - 2001



Global IPv6 Distribution*

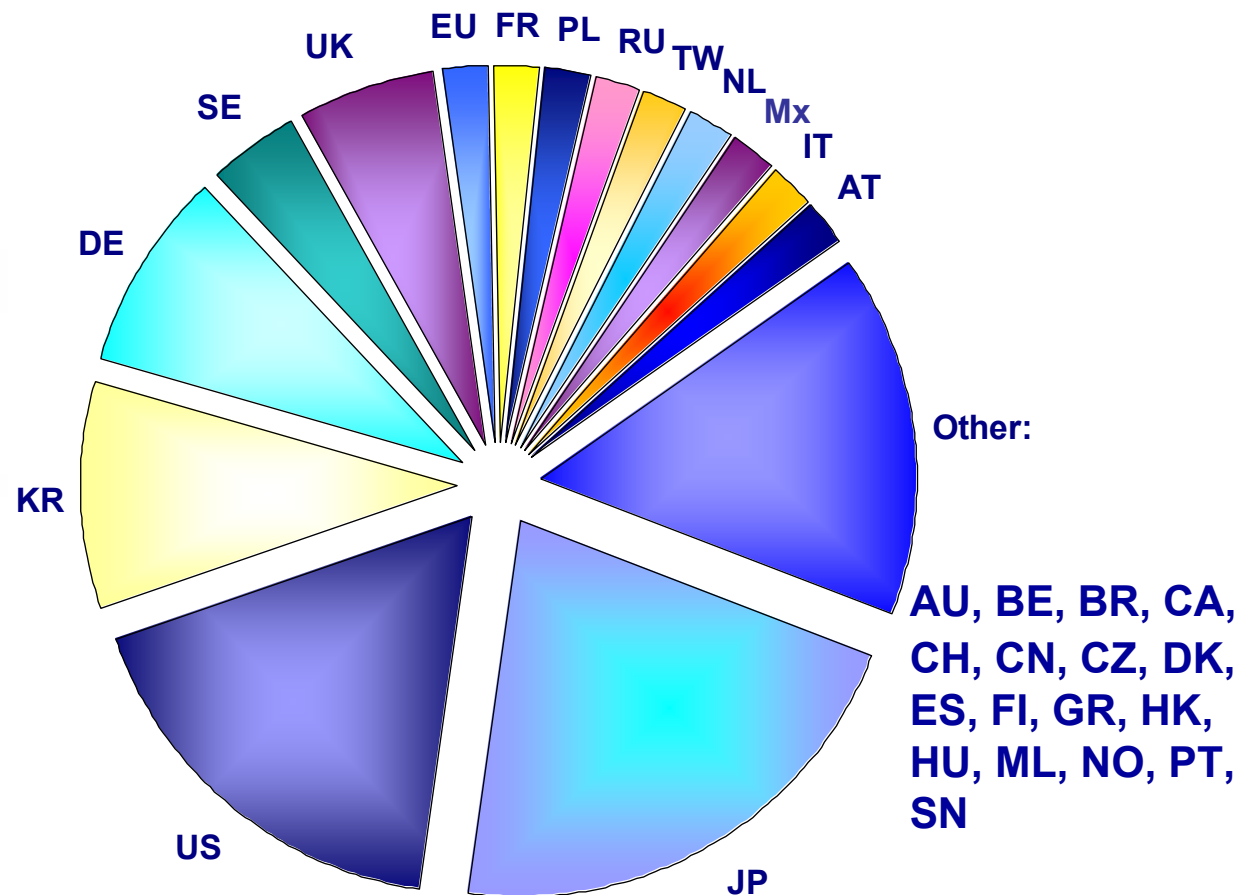

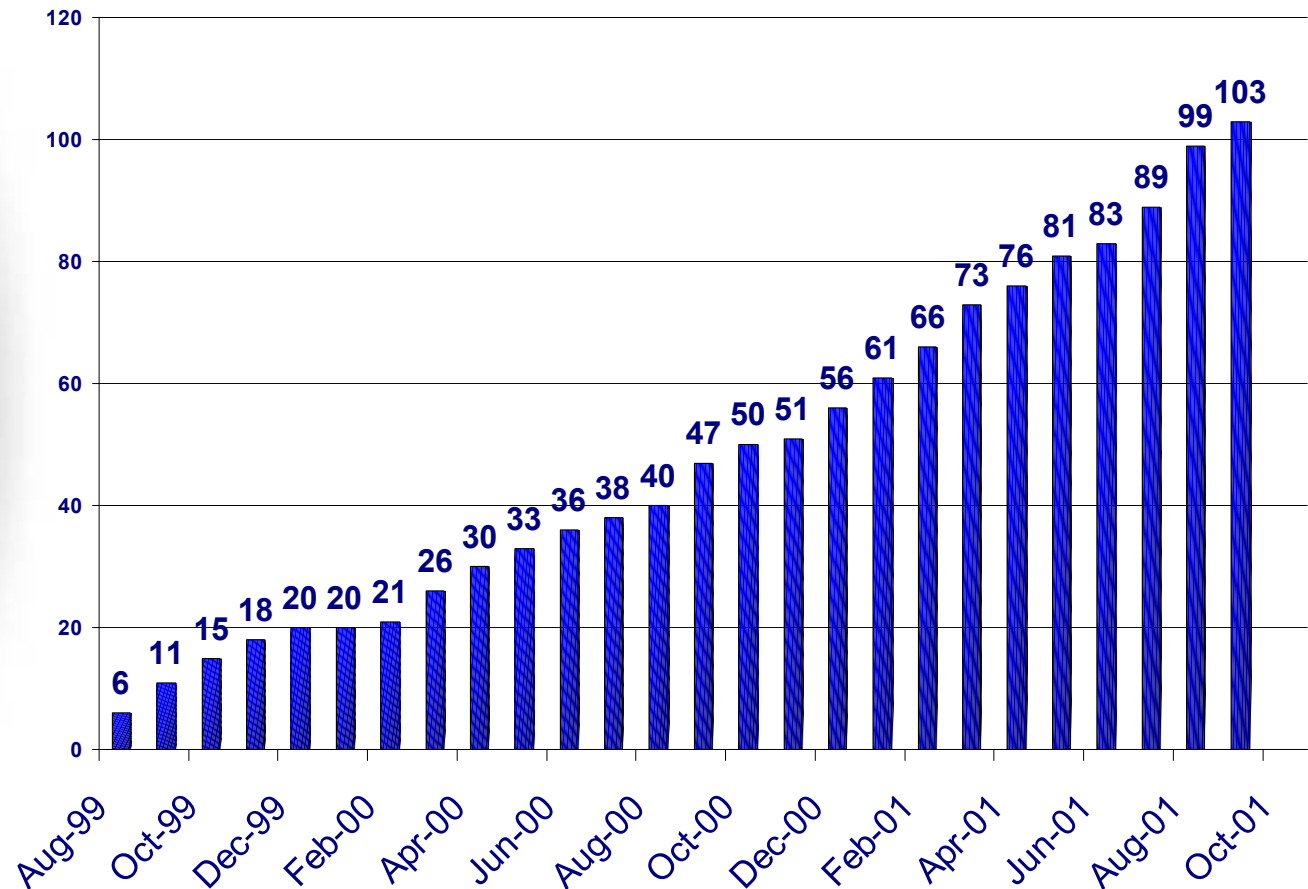

- LACNIC
 - ARIN visited LACNIC facilities in April 2001
 - Transition plan meeting at ARIN (July 2001)
 - Training of LACNIC staff ongoing
 - Open policy meeting November 2001
 - RIR application submitted to ICANN
- AfriNIC
 - Open policy meeting held in May 2001 at Accra, Ghana
 - Interim BoT meeting scheduled for January in Cairo

APNIC



- Certification authority
 - Member-only website under development
 - Demo at APNIC meeting
- Recently allocated 219/8 and 220/8
- RIR routing registry
 - Pilot Service – irr.apnic.net
 - Mirrors of RADB, RIPE data
- Second member survey
 - Undertaken by KPMG
 - Extensive consultation in region
- Policy
 - Small PI assignments for multi-homing
 - Proposal for portable allocation criteria

ARIN



- Improved/updated RWHOIS beta testing underway
- New database schema and registration software (Q2 2002) – beta testers needed
- IN-ADDR.ARPA
 - /8 servers operational
 - migration of /8s complete
- ARIN BoT and AC elections held
- Policy
 - /24 reassignments for multi-homed customers
 - Bulk copies of ARIN WHOIS database
 - Single orgs with multiple aggregation points

RIPE NCC



- Database migration completed
- RS improved
 - Staffing level significantly increased
 - Different prioritizing (requests > questions)
 - Improved response time
- PR activities enhanced
