## IPv4 Addressing in China

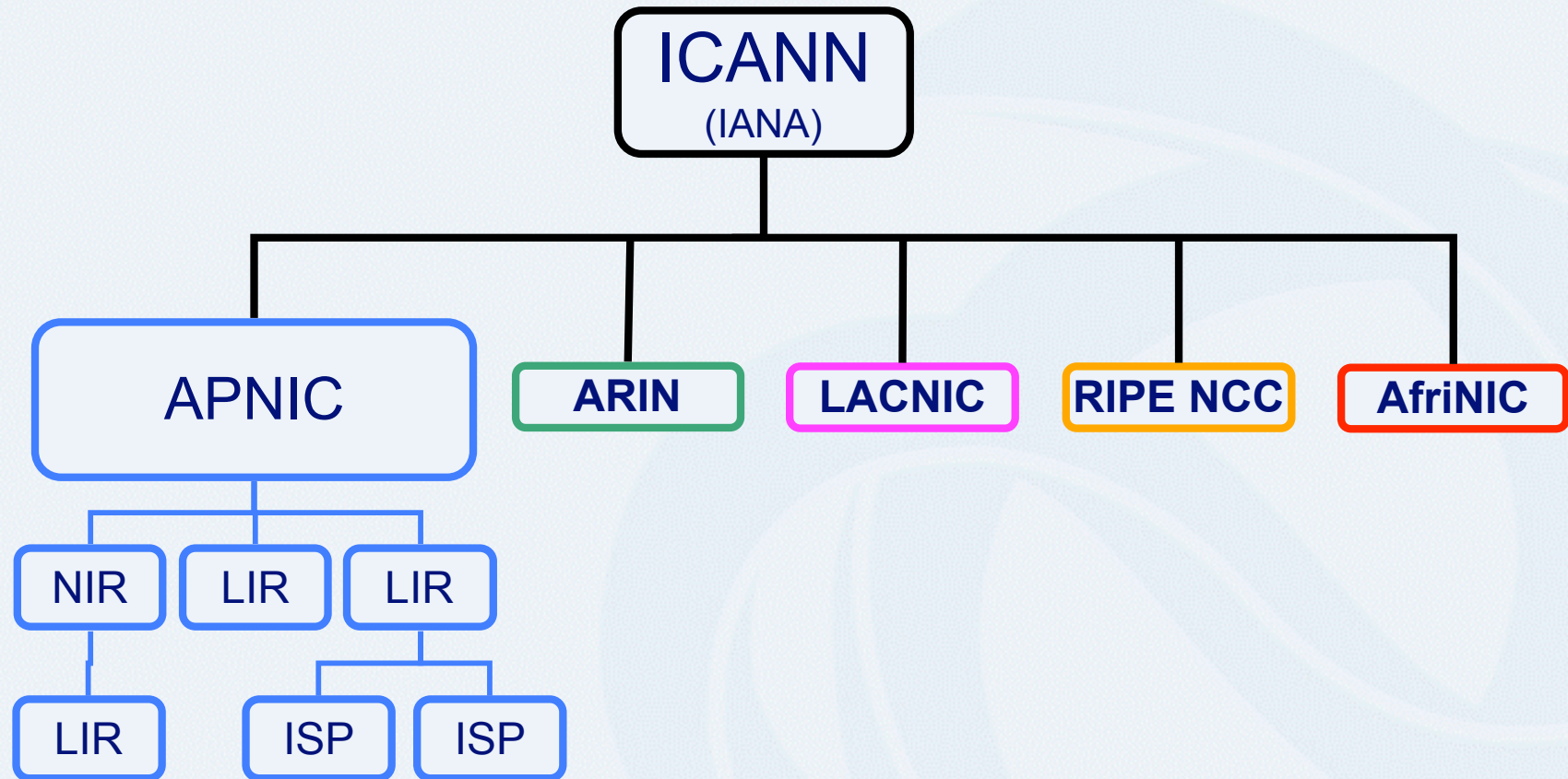
- China has 77,710,848 IPv4 addresses as at 31 March 2006. It is equal to  $4.63 * /8$ .
- IPv4 address space is not running out immediately, IANA still has  $62 * /8$  reserved for future allocations.
- There are strong growth of IPv4 address allocations to China since 2000.
- Organisation in China like others go through the same process to receive IPv4 addresses.

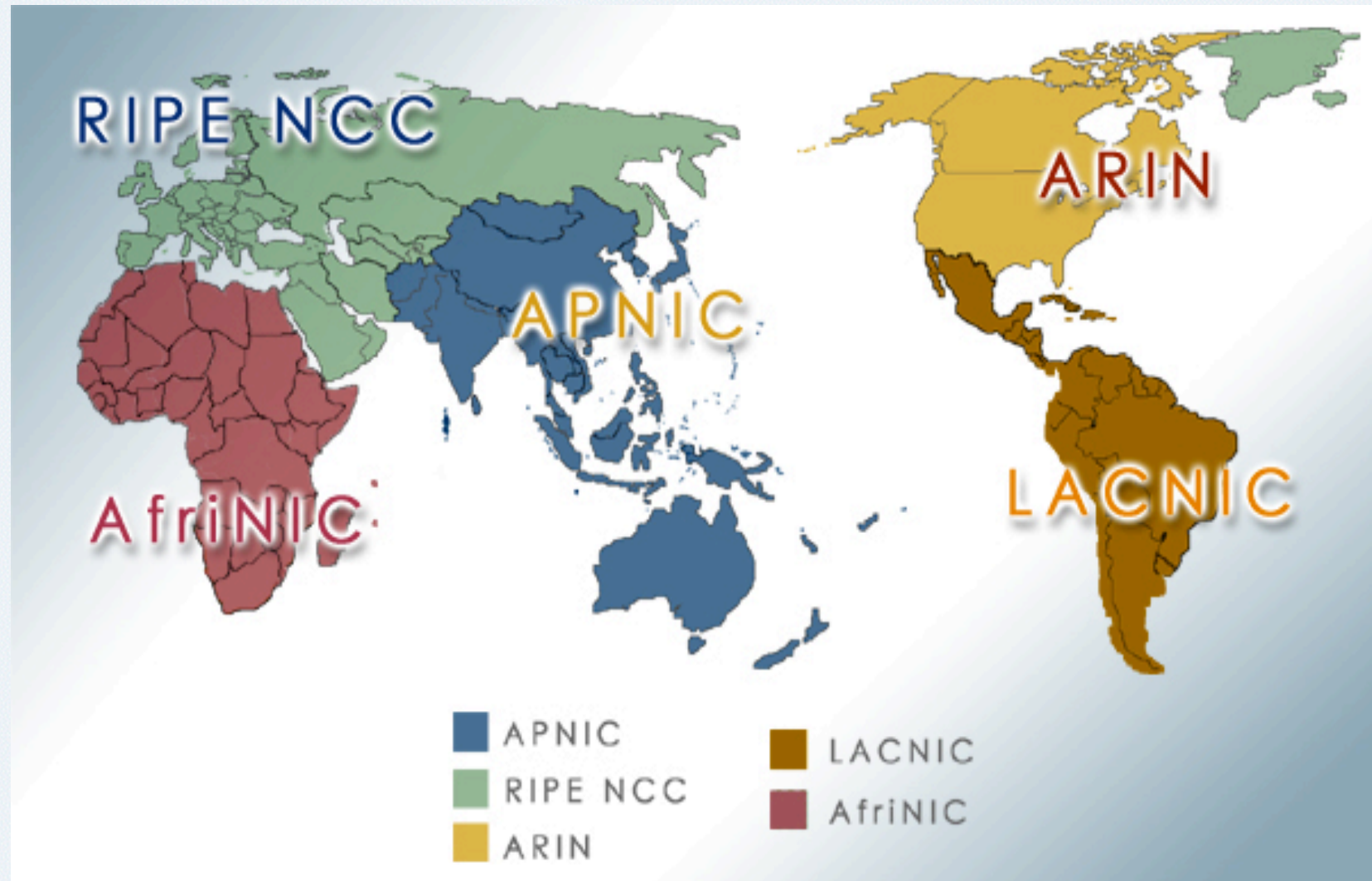


# What is APNIC?

- Regional Internet Registry (RIR) for the Asia Pacific region
  - One of five RIRs currently operating around the world
  - Non-profit, open membership organisation
  - Responsible for distributing Internet resources throughout the AP region
  - Industry self regulatory body

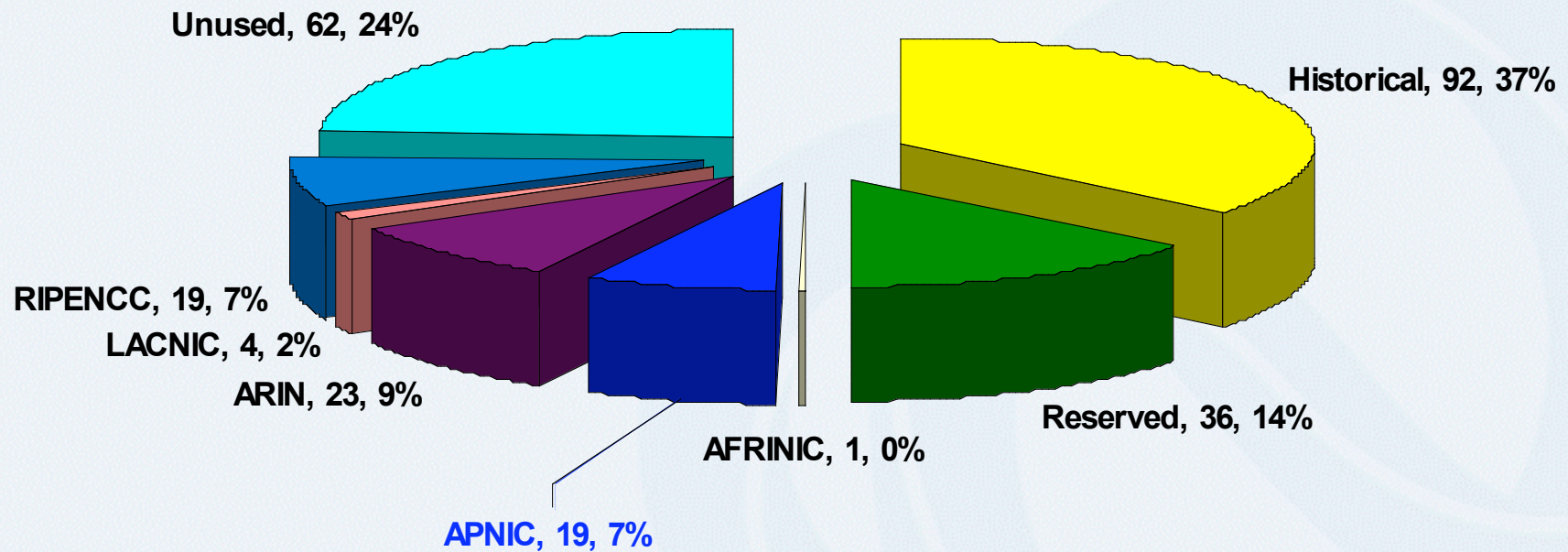

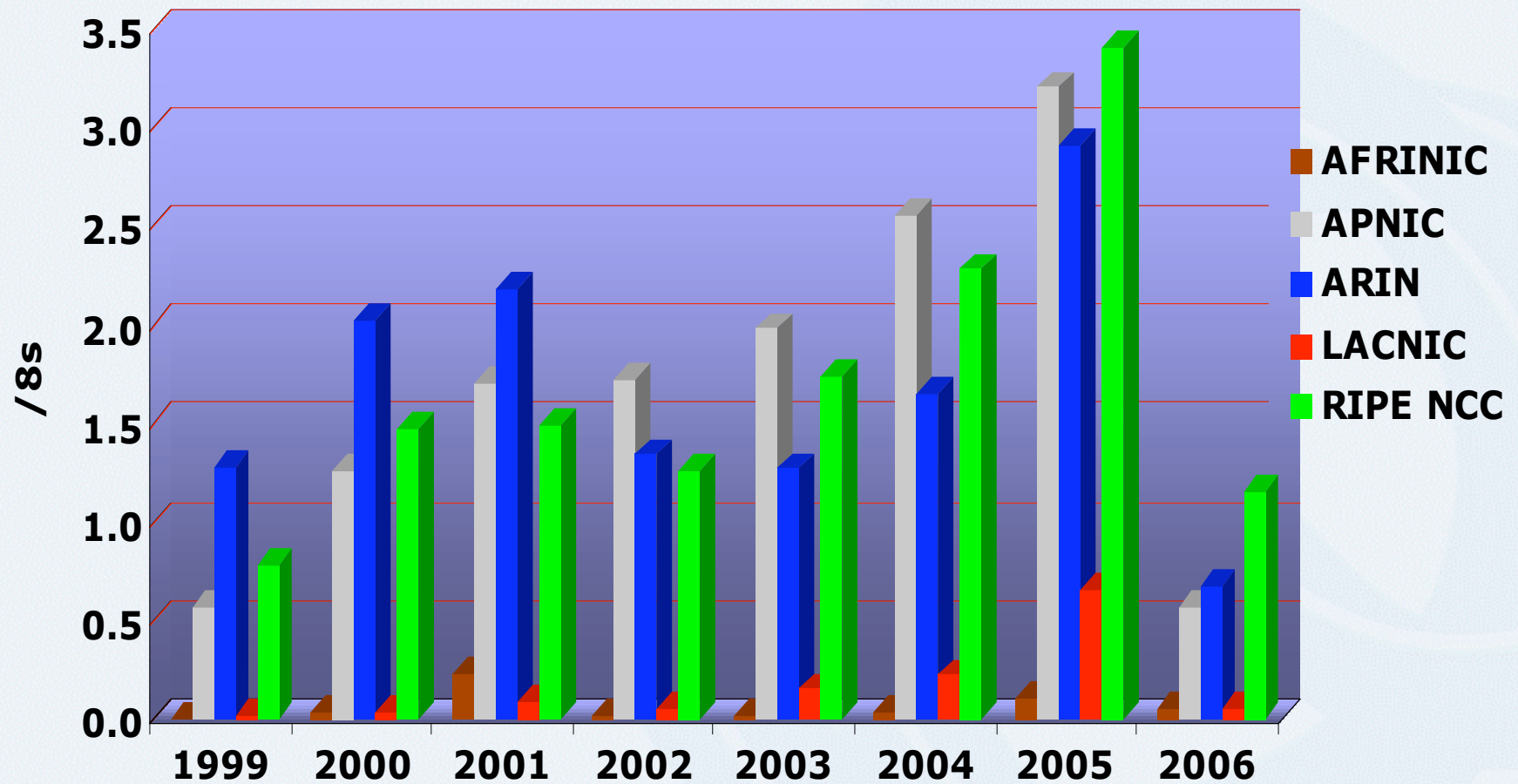


# IPv4 /8 Address Space Status





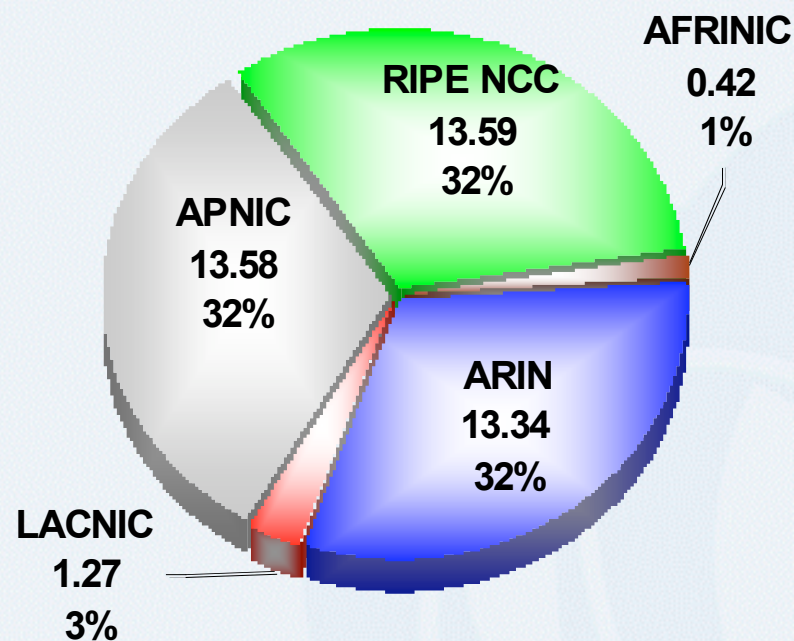
# IPv4 Allocations from RIRs to LIRs/ISPs Yearly Comparison





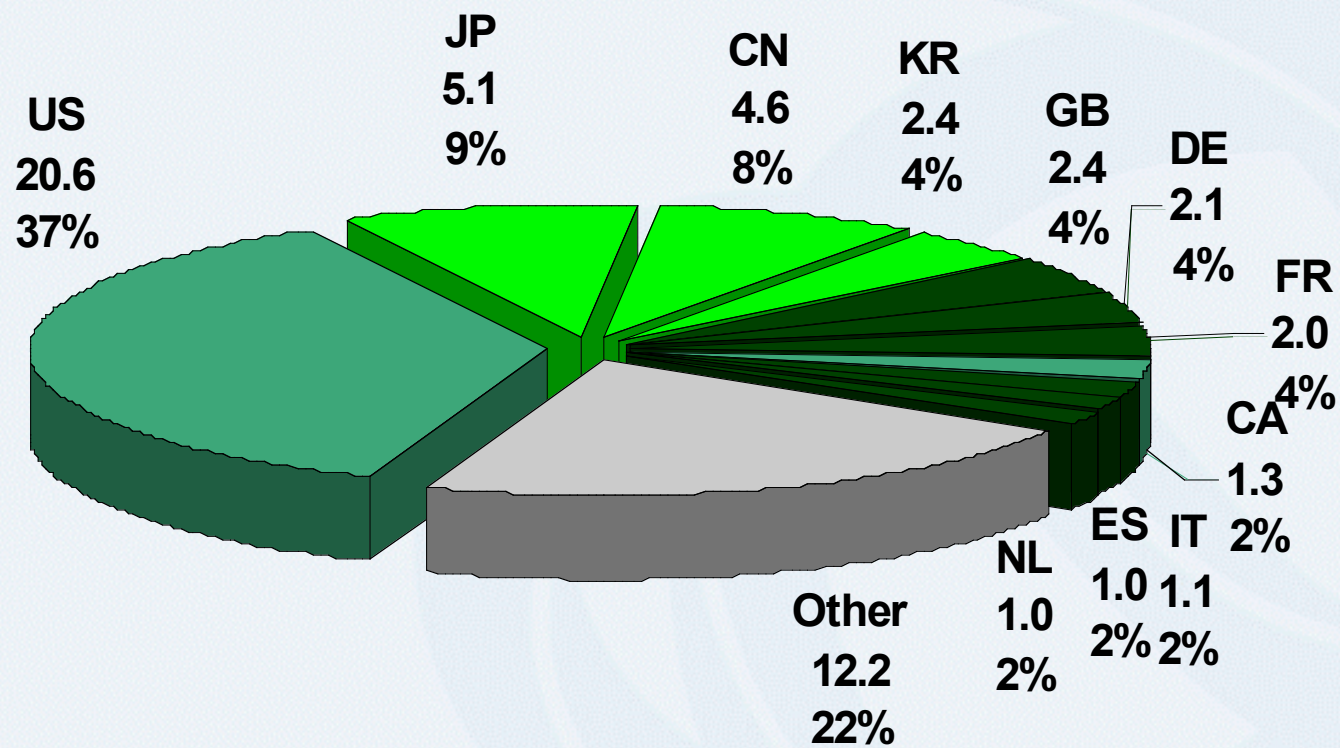
# IPv4 Allocations RIRs to LIRs/ISPs

Cumulative Total (Jan 1999 – Mar 2006)



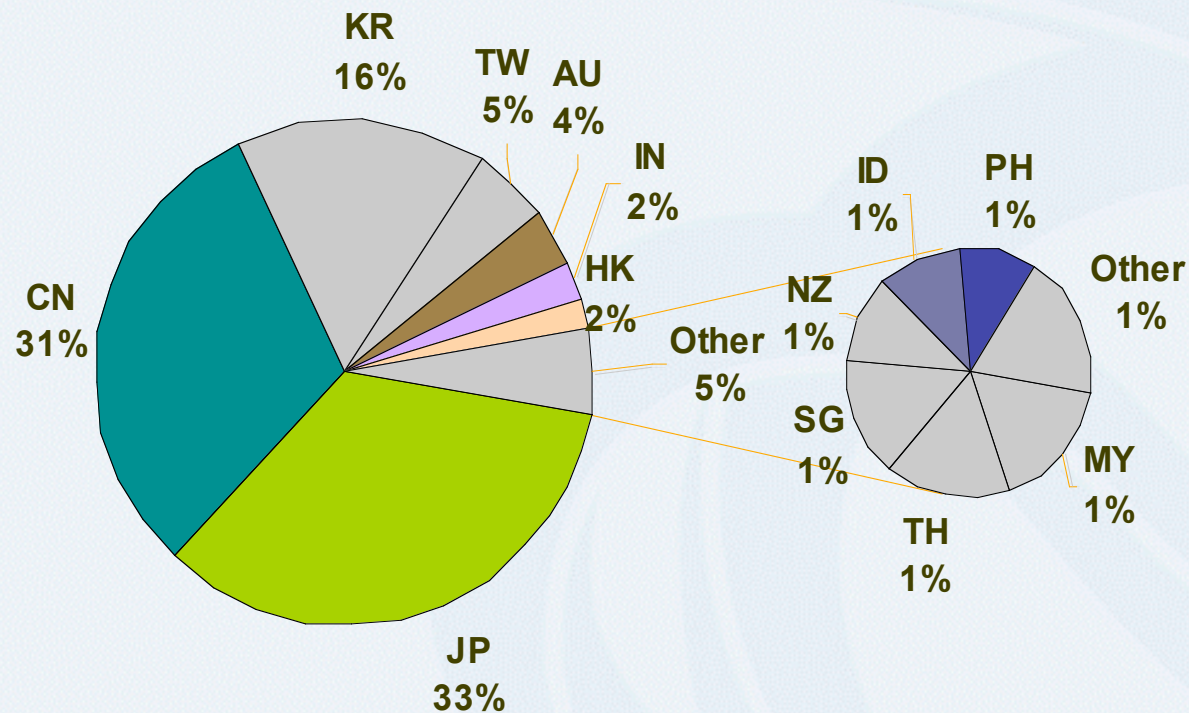


# RIR IPv4 Allocations by Economy



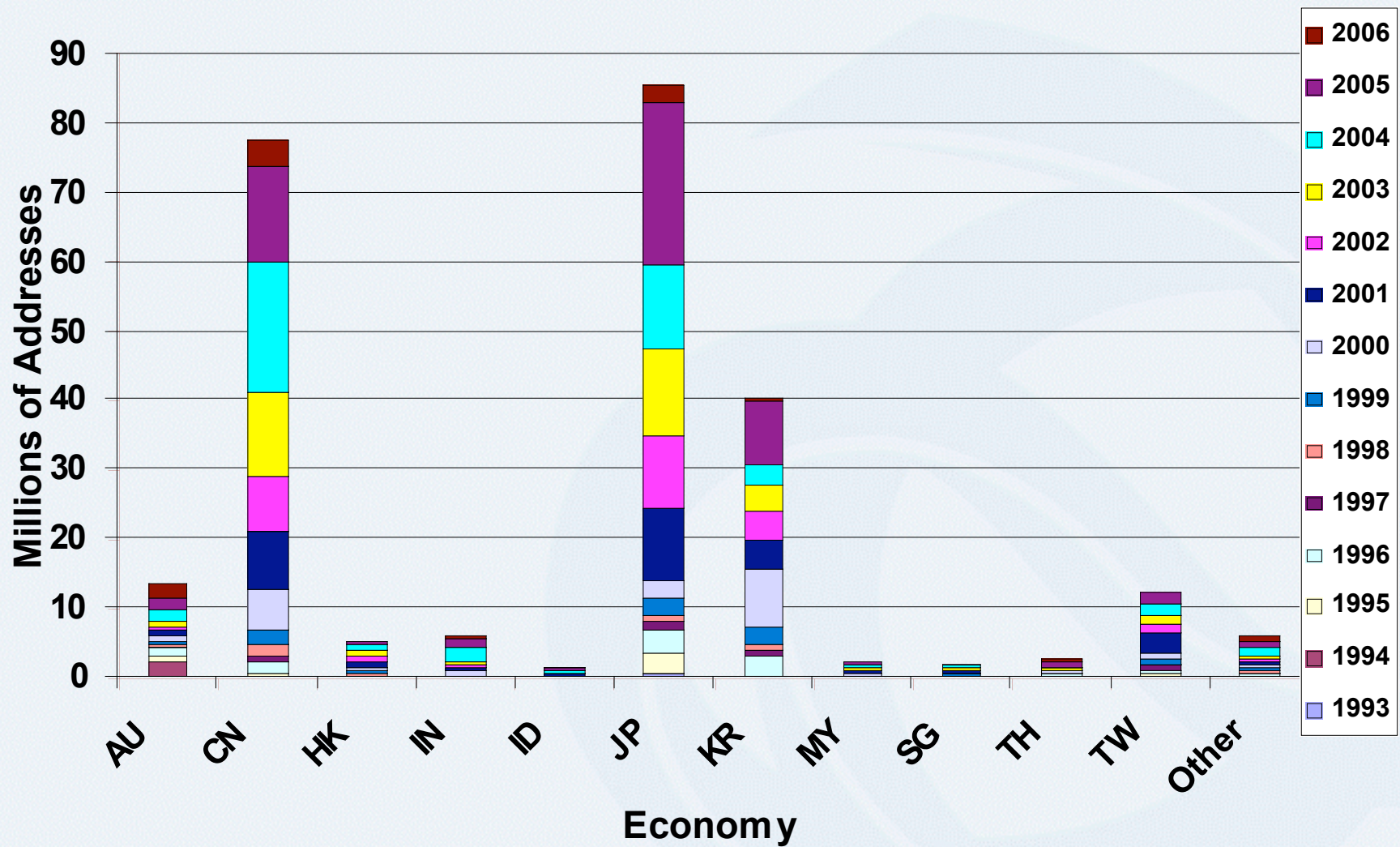


# IPv4 Address Allocations by Economy in AP Region





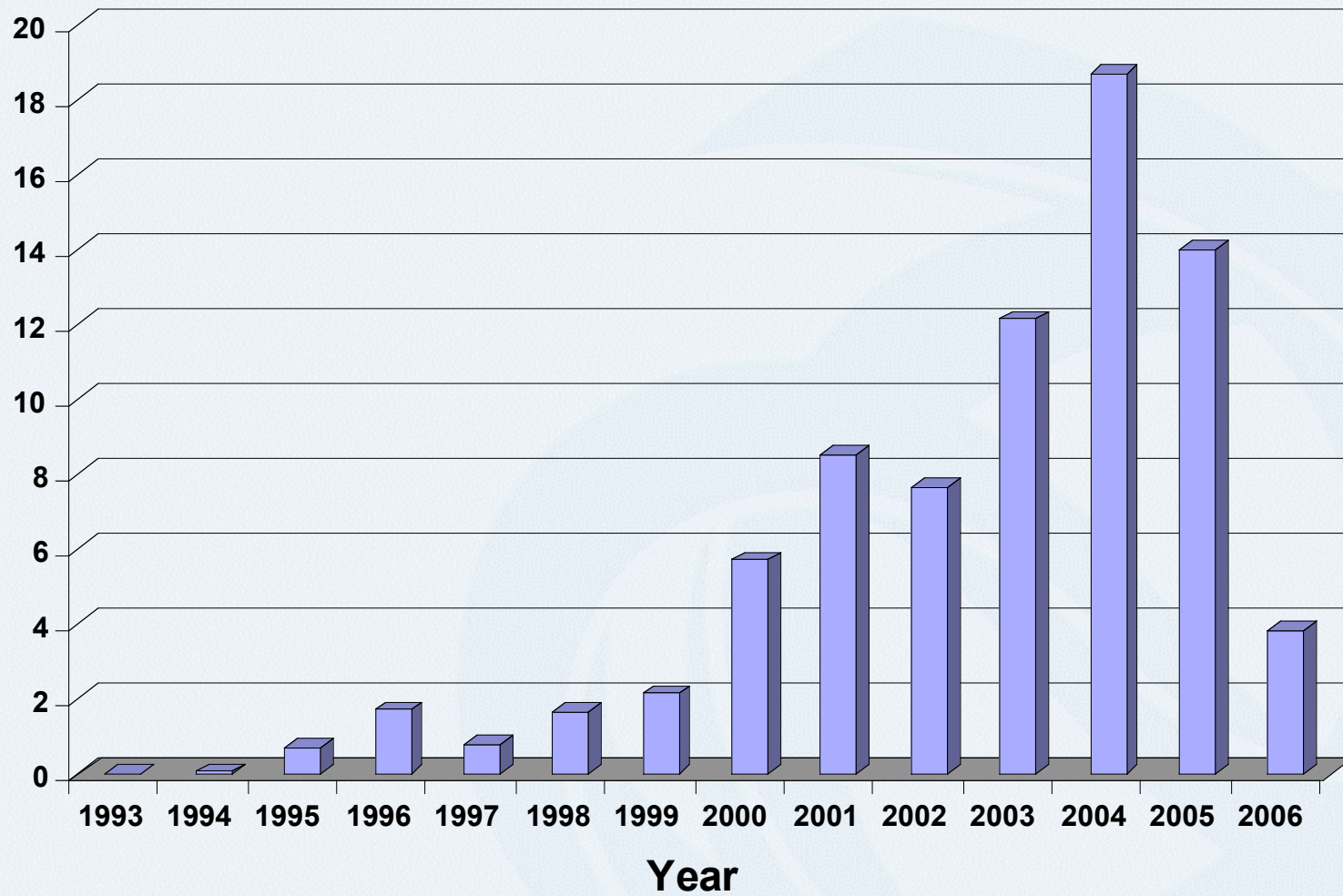
# IPv4 Address Allocations by Economy by Year in AP Region

  - Address space is non-portable
- 2. From CNNIC
  - CNNIC member
  - Address space is portable
- 3. From APNIC
  - APNIC member
  - Address space is portable
